
ORDER CANCELLING LICENSE

The Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) has reviewed its records and determined that Think Wine & Spirits Group, LLC, t/a The Local Vine Cellar Wine & Spirits, (Respondent), located at 425 11th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., has failed to pay the third year license fees for its License No. ABRA-087410 a Retailer's Class A License. Specifically, the Respondent failed to make the third year payment for its license by March 31, 2014, the deadline for all Retailer's A licenses, despite being notified of the payment date.

On May 1, 2014, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board (Board) issued an Order to Cease and Desist against Think Wine & Spirits Group, LLC, t/a The Local Vine Cellar Wine & Spirits, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-829 (2001), for failure to make the third year payment for its Retailer's Class A License. On May 6, 2014, ABRA's Enforcement Division confirmed that the Respondent is out of business.

It is hereby **ORDERED** on this 28th day of May, 2014, that Think Wine & Spirits Group, LLC's License No. ABRA-087410 is **CANCELLED**. A copy of this Order shall be sent to the Respondent.


