DO YOU NEED HELP?

ARE YOU BEING PHYSICALLY OR SEXUALLY ABUSED, OR DO YOU FEAR SUCH ABUSE?

The law protects you if you are being physically hurt, sexually assaulted, threatened, stalked, or had property destroyed by a person related to you by blood, legal custody, marriage, domestic partnership, have a child in common, share or had shared a mutual residence, romantic relationship (not necessarily sexual) or from a person who had one of the above relationships with your current domestic partner. **You do not have to be married, or related to the abuser, to be protected under the law.** Also, your immigration status does not affect your right to receive police assistance.

Any District of Columbia police officer who responds to an intrafamily call must prepare a report. Officers must arrest a person when there is probable cause to believe that the person committed an intrafamily offense. If both parties involved committed an intrafamily offense, the officer must take into account who was the primary aggressor, and whether one of the parties may have acted in self-defense.

Victims can get a free copy of their police report at the Police District where the incident occurred, or at the Police Headquarters, Public Documents Section, Room 3075, 300 Indiana Ave., NW. 202-727-4357

If the abuser has been arrested

If you are the victim, you should go to one of the Domestic Violence Intake Centers (DVIC) to speak with a victim advocate who will:

- Explain the criminal process and help you to understand your options.
- Provide you with other information and assistance.

CIVIL PROTECTION ORDERS (CPO)

Any domestic violence or dating violence victim, including victims less than 18 years of age, may seek a civil protection order to protect them from an abusive person. You do not have to call the police, or have your abuser arrested, to get a protection order. You also do not need an attorney to request an order. A civil protection order can direct the abuser to:

- Stop assaulting, threatening, harassing, stalking, or abusing you and your family member(s).
- Leave your shared home, and turn over the keys to the residence.
- Stay 100 feet away from you, your children, and other family members.
- Return your personal property, or pay you for out-of-pocket losses/expenses.
- Pay child support.
- Attend counseling for domestic violence and/or substance abuse.

The order may also grant you custody of your children, and provide other relief to help keep you safe. To request a CPO, go to one of the Domestic Violence Intake Centers (DVIC).

- Assistance in languages other than English.
- Free or low-cost legal representation.
- Information about crime victims' compensation funds.
- Free legal representation, counseling, and safety planning
